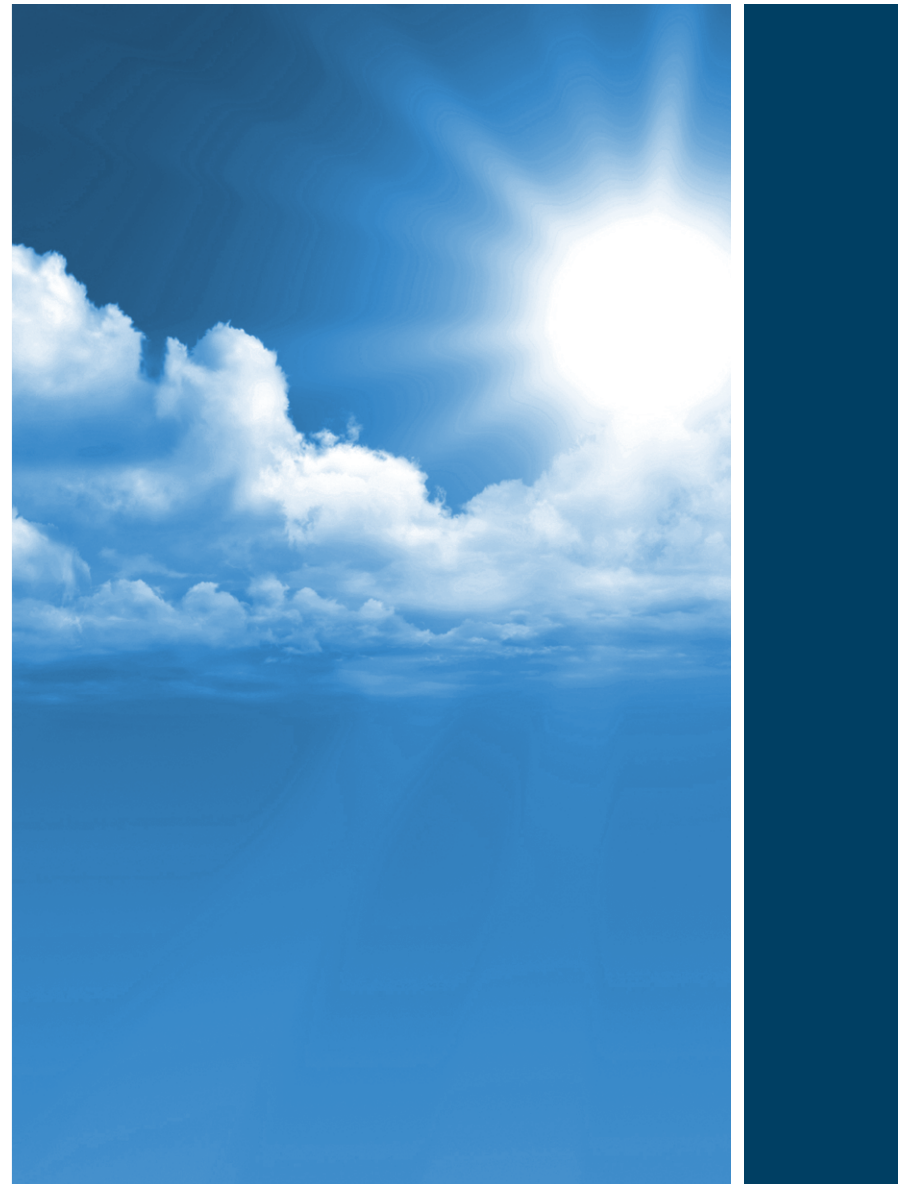

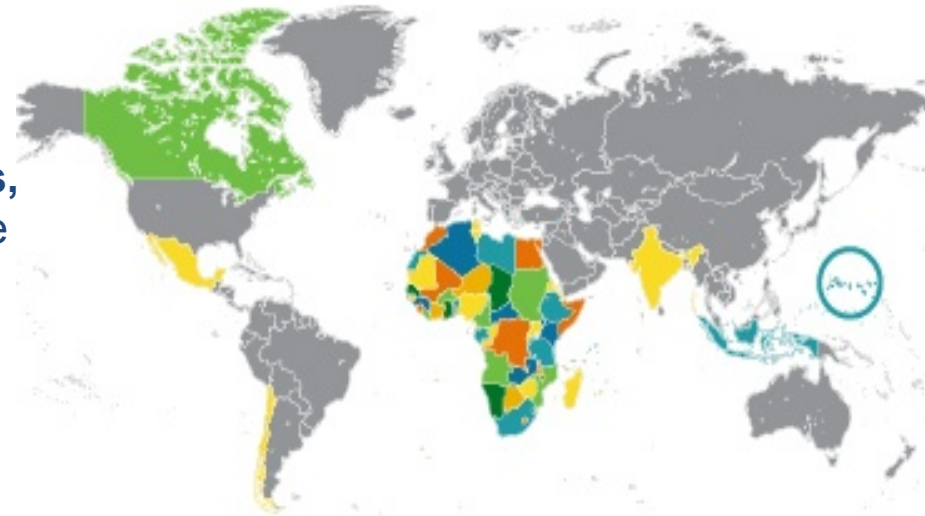

He is a member of China's National Energy Advisory Council, the Expert-Committee of National High-tech Program, and Academy Committee of China's Environmental Protection Ministry. He serves as the vice-chairman of China Renewable Energy Society, a board member of the Global Wind Energy Council, and the vice-chairman of the Renewable Energy Policy Network (REN21). Mr. Li has dedicated 30 years of his career to energy economy and energy environment studies. He was in charge of the structure and drafting of China's Renewable Energy Law and China's Medium and Long-Term Development Plan for Renewable Energy Development.

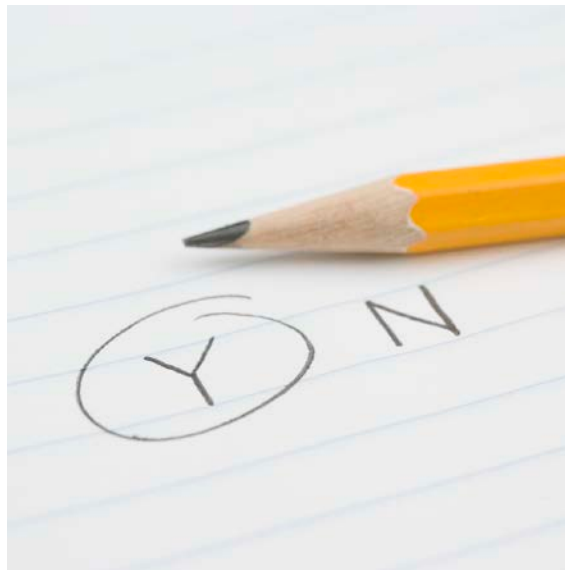
