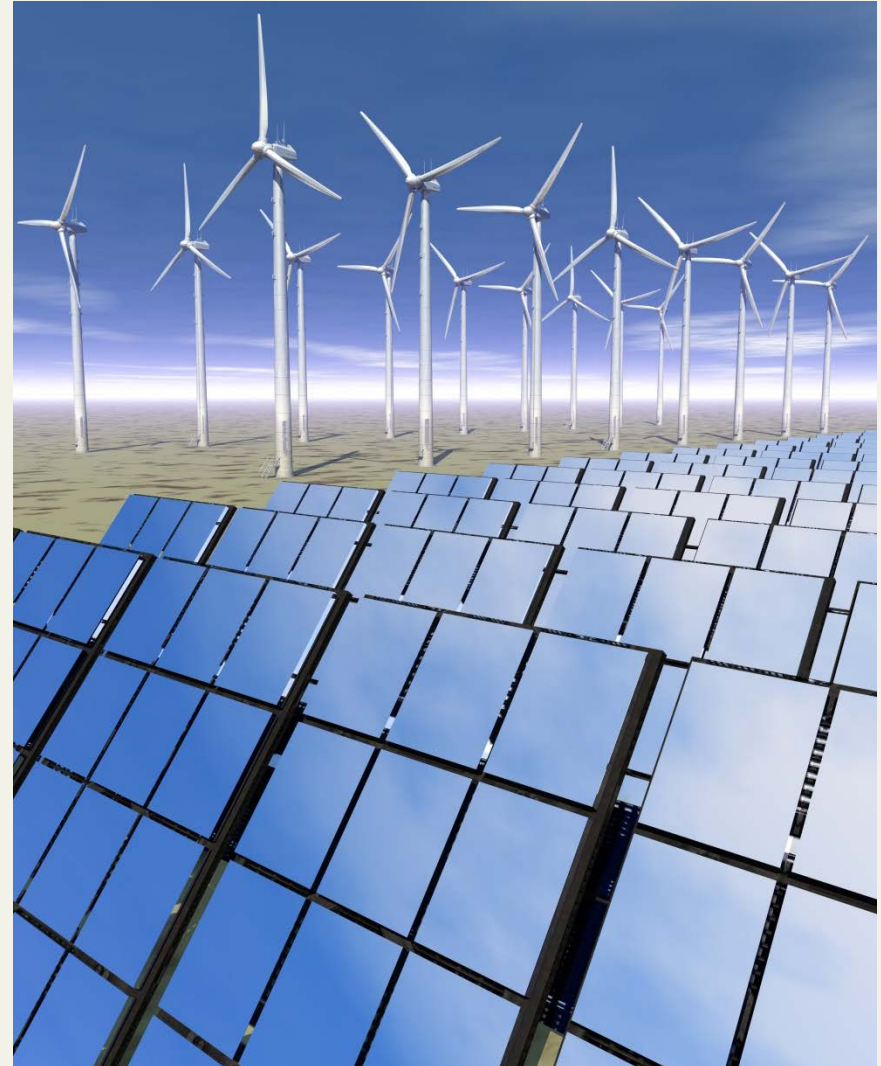

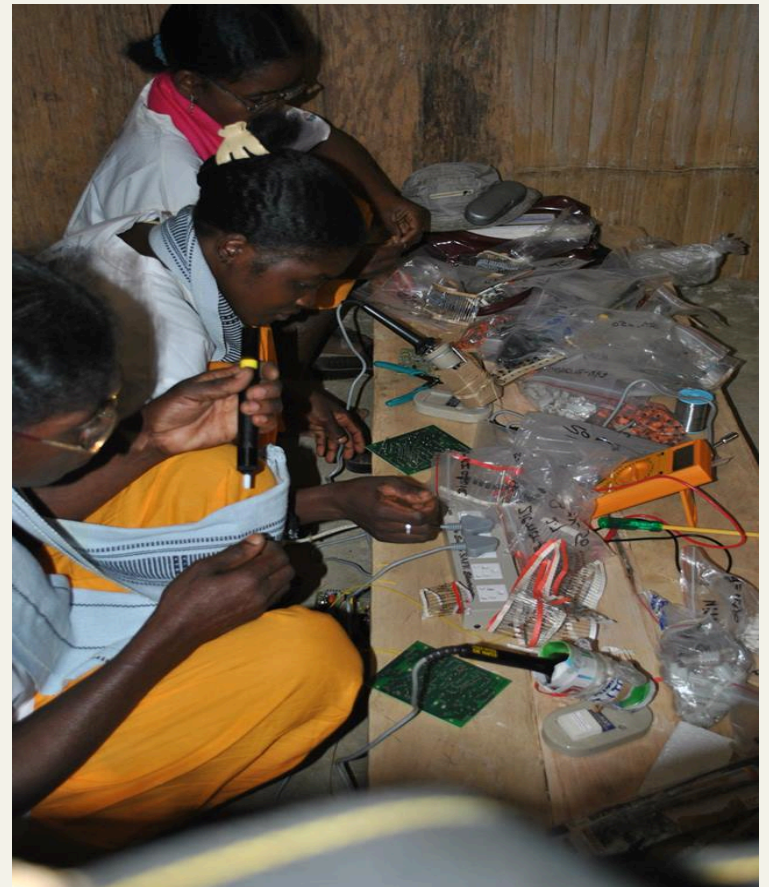

Overview of WWF's Sustainable Energy work and key approaches in Africa.

1. Scientific Research
2. Policy advocacy (e.g. SEAFs)
3. CSO capacity strengthening
4. Sustainable Energy access field interventions (9 pilots)



KEY RESULTS

- **Time:** +10 years (2007-2015)
- **Policies:** Nearly 80 national and international energy policies reviewed & supported e.g. SE4ALL)
- **Energy Access:** +1.2million people – clean cooking & lighting (by 2015 end)
- **CSO capacity strengthening:** 60 beneficiaries
- **Total investment:** +USD\$ 20m



Reflections on Practical Actions “Poor People’s Energy Outlook 2016”

- The PPEO2016 Report is timely and relevant to our sustainable energy work in Africa
- The report findings are validated to be true based on our experiences in Africa.
- We need a bottom up approach to overcome energy poverty in Africa.
